

### Brief Description:

### CHILD DEVELOPMENT PERMITS

Child Development Permits are available at various levels. Each level has one or more ways to qualify. Individuals must meet all of the requirements listed in **one** of the available options. Individuals should review all available options and complete the one that best reflects their own education and/or experience.

### Levels of the Child Development Permit

- Child Development Assistant Permit
- Child Development Associate Teacher Permit
- Child Development Teacher Permit
- Child Development Master Teacher Permit
- · Child Development Site Supervisor Permit
- · Child Development Program Director Permit

### School-Age Emphasis Authorization

The School Age Emphasis Authorization may be added to any level Child Development Permit and authorizes the holder to provide all services authorized by the holder's Child Development Permit and to provide services in the care, development, and instruction of children in before-school, after-school, and other school-age child care programs.

### The Application Packet

Individuals applying for a Child Development Permit must submit a completed application packet consisting of all of the following:

- Official transcripts verifying course work and/or letters verifying experience appropriate to the permit type
- 2. Completed application (form 41-4)
- Application processing fees
- First-time applicants must submit a completed LiveScan receipt (<u>form 41-LS</u>) verifying that fingerprints have been taken and fees have been paid. Out-of-state residents must submit two fingerprint cards (FD-258) and fingerprint <u>processing fees</u> in lieu of a LiveScan receipt.

### Course Work Requirements

- 1. All course work must be degree-applicable (associate degree or higher) and non-remedial
- All course work must be completed with a grade of "C" or better ("pass" and "credit" grades meet this requirement)
- All core course work must meet a minimum unit requirement of three semester units or four quarter units (see Terms and Definitions)
- 4. All course work must be completed at a regionally-accredited college or university

## STEP 2: LEARN ABOUT TEACHING CREDENTIALS

### What is a Credential?

- \* A credential is an **AUTHORIZATION** to teach a subject or subjects in a school setting grades K-12.
- \* The only body authorized to issue credentials in California is the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC).
- Issued based on a recommendation from a college, university, or school district after a student completes the requirements for the credential.

### **ELEMENTARY TEACHING**

### **Multiple Subject Credential**

This credential authorizes a person to teach in a classroom where many different subjects are taught by a single individual, such as elementary schools.

### **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHING**

### Things you need to know if you want to teach elementary school

To become an elementary school teacher in California you will need to earn a Multiple Subjects Credential. Prior to enrolling a credential program, you will need to complete a bachelor's degree, fulfill your basic skills requirement and demonstrate subject matter competency. In other words, you have to demonstrate that you know the subjects that you will be teaching. As an elementary school teacher you will be teaching a lot of subjects to one class, so you need knowledge of a wide variety of subjects. You will need to pass the CSET (California Subject Examination for Teachers) to show your subject matter competency. Depending on the credential program you attend, you will need to either pass this test before you enter a credential program or before you begin your student teaching.

You can get a Bachelor's degree in *any* major you want. In California, there is no major in "education" or "teaching". Some popular majors include liberal studies, child development, human services, psychology or sociology. You can choose any major to study, just remember that you will want to also take courses to help you pass the CSET.

You will also need to fulfill your "basic skills requirement". You can do so in one of the following ways:

- Pass the CBEST test OR
- Pass the CSET: Multiple Subject Plus Writing Skills Examination OR
- Pass the California State University (CSU) Early Assessment Program (EAP) (English and Mathematics sections)

Keep in mind that while you are preparing to become a teacher, you also need to meet the transfer requirements for the four-year university you to which you plan on transferring, as well as complete the general education requirements and lower-division courses for your major.

Ideally, the courses you choose for general education should also help prepare you for the CSET.

### SECONDARY TEACHING

### Single Subject Credential

This credential authorizes a person to teach a particular subject, such as English or Math at Junior High or High School.

## HIGH SCHOOL

### Things you need to know if you want to teach high school

To become a secondary education teacher in California you will need to earn a **Single Subject Credential**. Prior to enrolling in a credential program, you will need to complete a bachelor's degree, fulfill your basic skills requirement and demonstrate subject matter competency. In other words, you have to demonstrate that you know the subject that you will be teaching. Currently, you have TWO ways of demonstrating this:

a. By completing the state approved subject matter preparation program (SMPP) in the subject that you want to teach. Typically you would also get a bachelor's degree in that subject. For example, if you wanted to teach English, you could get a Bachelor's degree in English and complete an English subject matter preparation program.

OR

b. By passing the California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET) in your specific subject area. For example, if you wanted to teach History, you would need to pass the CSET: Social Science Examination.

You will also need to fulfill your "basic skills requirement". You can do so in one of the following ways:

- Pass the CBEST test OR
- Pass the California State University (CSU) Early Assessment Program (EAP) (English and Mathematics sections)

- This credential authorizes a person to work with children with special needs. The person holding this credential can with elementary, junior high or high school students.
- Specializations include:
  - + Mild/Moderate Disabilities
  - + Moderate/Severe Disabilities
  - + Visual Impairments
  - + Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing
  - + Physical and Health Impairments
  - + Early Childhood Special
- Choose Track:
  - + Elementary Education or Middle School/High School

# BASIC REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PRELIMINARY CREDENTIAL

- Bachelor's degree
  - + From an accredited college or university
- Basic Skills Competency
  - + Basic skills test in reading, writing, and math
    - × Passing score CSU EAP in both English & Math (taken in high school) OR
    - × California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST) OR
    - CSET Multiple Subjects + CSET Writing Skills
- × U.S. Constitution requirement
  - + College course or examination (POSC 100)

### Subject matter competence

+ Must document expertise and knowledge in subject you plan to teach by passing California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET) for multiple subjects or through state approved course work <u>or</u> CSET for single subject.

### Professional preparation program

+ Often called a credential of 5<sup>th</sup> year program, includes student teaching
