- Fashion Orientation Wednesday August 19 at 10am via Zoom
- Videos, lectures, and assignments on Canvas for fall classes
- Assignments are submitted on Canvas. Some may be submitting pictures of assignments, varies by instructor
- Some courses are fully online utilizing Canvas.
- Some classes have mandatory zoom meetings every week or several times a semester (see schedule of classes for how the courses are offered) and will also be using Canvas for lectures
- If there is a lab, they will start class online via Zoom meetings. If they are able to resume class on campus, they will use the lab on campus. Right now they are thinking of alternating students to come every other week to limit the amount of students in the classroom but they stated to plan availability in case they change to face to face (Example fashion 81 and 88, 101, 108)
- However, they cannot make students attend in person courses if they are not comfortable coming back to school yet
- Sewing machine donations from Singer Company is going to be available in the fall. If they need a sewing machine to borrow for the fall, they can contact their instructor to borrow.
- Fashion 145-Field Studies in Fashion course is going to have virtual field trips
- Fashion internship- not offered in the Fall; if this is student's last course, they would encourage students to complete it in the Spring. Course substitution for fall would need to similar and be worked out with the department, but should encourage to be done in the Spring.
- Courses that require specific programs such as CAD, optitech or pad system they are looking
 for a way to log into computers into the campus virtually (still in the works) or students can
 purchase creative suite online but they cannot require students to purchase. They stated that
 offering the remote access to FC computers is a high priority.
- If they will be opening the classrooms for labs, they will take the following precautions: social distancing, temperature checks, gloves, masks, hand sanitizers and potentially some shields between stations. There will also be specific entrance and exit into the 700 building
- Students are not required to go back in person if they do not feel comfortable
