Degrees & Certificates

- Child Development & Educational Studies (CDES) Associate in Arts Degree
 - Prepares students for employment as teachers or teacher's assistants in private preschools or children's centers. This degree also prepares students majoring in CDES for transfer to a four-year institution.
- Early Childhood Education (ECE) Associate in Arts Degree
 - Provides students with preparation for employment working with children from birth through age 8 in early care and education programs, public and private preschools, and children's centers.
 - Practicum hours will be completed for this degree at our CDES Lab School on campus (CDES 121 Role Teacher Assistant or CDES 225 Student Teaching Practicum)



Degrees & Certificates Continued...

Early Childhood Education Associate in Science Degree for Transfer

- Also called the ECE AS-T, prepares students to transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor's degrees in Early Childhood Education.
- Child and Adolescent Development Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer
 - Also called the AA-T (or ADT), prepares students to transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor's degrees in Child and Adolescent Development.
- Elementary Teacher Education Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer
 - Also called the Elementary Teacher Education AA-T Degree, prepares students to transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor's degrees in Liberal Studies or Integrated Teacher Education Programs.



The CDES Laboratory School has a three-fold mission:

Education of children ages 2 through 5 years old:

- Providing a challenging, emergent curriculum that is inspired by the Reggio philosophy from Italy, emphasizing the Constructivist Approach and nature-based learning.
- Strengthening relationships between children, families, our department and students as well the Fullerton and greater North Orange County community.

Professional education of students:
